- To Register for the 2018 Summer Program – 2 options are available:

- **Parent/Student Orientation – Saturday, June 2, 2018 – 11a-12:30p** – all registered students and at least one parent should attend Orientation. Camp schedules and liability forms will be provided. Location for orientation will be emailed to all registered students.
- **TUITION:**
 - Tuition for all students will be processed online.
 - **Scholarship Students (max 40 students)** – full camp tuition is due at registration for Weeks 1-5. Scholarship students are required to attend Weeks 1-5. See *Community Scholarship* requirements below.
- Refund Policy (effective after June 2, 2018) - There will be no refunds or partial payments for late arrivals, withdrawals or early departures including dismissal from camp due to rule violations.

Community Scholarship (40 slots available):

Students applying to and eligible for the Community Scholarship must meet the requirements below. All requirements are established by the Kids Hope Alliance, KHA [formerly The Jacksonville Children's Commission (JCC)] and are subject to change prior to registration. Student applicant must:

1. Have a clean behavior history. (Minor issues will be reviewed by TLA staff upon application.)
2. Be in grades 6th thru 8th – for the upcoming (2018-2019) school year.
3. A Duval County resident.
4. **Attend the summer program for the first 5 weeks – for at least 3 days per week.**
5. **Bring proof/documentation required below to Orientation. No Community Scholarship applications will be accepted without documentation required below.**
6. And one of the following:
 - a. Special Education. Requires proof of:
 - i. IEP (Individual Education Plan)
 - ii. Form from the school with the child's name and current school year date
 - iii. McKay Scholarship (proof from school)
 - b. Community Eligible Student: Enrolled in one of the Duval County Public Schools that are participating in the National School Lunch and School Breakfast Programs that classified as 100% Free/Reduced Lunch for 2015-2016 school year or documented by a student report card from one of those schools.
 - c. Students residing within a zip code of a Title 1 school - documented by a student report card.
 - d. Students with Family Income at or below 185% of The Federal Poverty Level documented by:
 - i. Copy of Hero's or Step Up for Students Scholarship Letter.
 - ii. Documentation of Temporary Assistance for Needy Families, WIC, and/or Medicaid or
 - iii. Verification that household family income does not exceed 185% of the Federal Poverty Level. See chart below.

Work Program Applicants:

The Teen Leaders of America Summer Work Program is open to high school Juniors and Seniors. Participants are required to attend the Summer Leadership Program; but at no cost to parents. Applicants should apply online; and will be contacted for interviews. During the interviews, staff will share expectations of participants. Participants will receive a \$500 work stipend.
